Abstract: The article presents an attempt to reconcile realism and anti-realism, or idealism, using theories of pragmatism and polymorphism developed by Charles S. Peirce. It is argued that the world does, in fact, exist independently of human perception, but any unique representation of this reality will necessarily be inadequate. Peirce's account of such issues is said to be subject to a range of possible interpretations on the topic of unique truths, so the polymorphic nature of reality is introduced as a defining principle of the theory.
