**Term:** Likeness

**Quote:** ... the relation of a representa<sup>m</sup>en to its object (correlate) may be a real relation and, then, either an agreement or a difference, or it may be an ideal r[elati]on or one from which the reference to a correspondent (subject of representation) cannot be prescinded by position. In the first case, that is where the representa<sup>m</sup>en has a real agreement with its object, the representation consists in a *likeness*; a simple quality of the object is shown but the object itself is not said to exist.
