**Term:** Subject [in representation]

**Quote:** Representation implies first an *object* represented; 2nd a mind or rather abstracting from the personal element, a representation (itself or other) to which it addresses itself. I call this the *subject*. 3rd a *Ground* or Reason which determines it to represent that object to that subject. We have nothing else implied in the representation as representation.
