**Quote:** In volition [...] there is always a double consciousness, the volition being at once regarded as an effort of one subject and a resistance of another. Likewise in perception there is a double consciousness of an *ego* and a non-*ego*. Thus there is a double consciousness which ought to replace the narrower volition of the old divisions of consciousness.
