Quote: The whole discussion of the logical nature of the different kinds of possible signs makes up the first division of logic, or *Speculative Grammar*. The second division, *Critic*, discusses the relation of signs to their objects, that is, their truth. The third division, *Methodetic*, discusses the relations of signs to their interpretants, that is, their knowledge-producing value.
