**Quote:** Tagmatic Science may be defined as all that knowledge that is collected in books for a purpose other than that of showing how it can be usefully applied to a definite purpose or class of purposes, but for one of these three ends, 1<sup>st</sup>, to enable those who consult the books to learn all known facts concerning certain subjects, 2<sup>nd</sup>, to furnish the history of attempts to gain certain kinds of knowledge or 3<sup>dly</sup>, to base upon the the collection some theory or philosophy of science.
